Academic Orientation Program Instructions

for Admitted MSU CAMP Students

Students are required to sign the following Program Regulations, Guidelines and information.

Regulations, Guidelines and other important information for the Academic Orientation Program

Michigan State University expects all participants in the Academic Orientation Program (AOP) to comply with University ordinances and policies. In particular, participants should be aware of the following University policies and ordinances:

- The possession or use of alcoholic beverages or illegal drugs is prohibited.
- The possession or use of firearms or weapons is prohibited.

Violation of either of these policies/ordinances while participating in AOP will result in disciplinary action. Disciplinary action may include dismissal from AOP, postponement of enrollment, or revocation of admission to Michigan State University. Violations of these University ordinances are also violations of the law and could result in arrest and criminal penalties.

Students attending AOP are also expected to observe the following regulations:

- Attend the entire AOP, which includes the overnight stay and all Day 2 activities (June/July AOP dates only).
- Be on time for all events.
- Remain where orientation events are taking place.
- Attend all scheduled events.

Student Signature:

Students who violate AOP regulations may have their courses dropped, receive a Hold on their student account, be required to repeat AOP or may have their admissions postponed until Spring Semester.

Students attending AOP are also expected to observe the following guidelines:

- Family members cannot attend the student academic orientation program.
- Do not text during presentations. Turn off cell phones and pagers during presentations, advising and course enrollment.
- Be considerate of all faculty, staff and other students attending AOP

EMERGENCY INFORMATION. It is unusual for a student to have an accident when attending the Academic Orientation Program. If a student is injured while the student is participating in AOP, Michigan State University reserves the right to call or an emergency vehicle, including an ambulance. If it is necessary to transport a student in the ambulance, the student will be responsible for meeting any expenses incurred.
